

The Committee of Experts approved the draft provisional agenda of its eleventh session, shall be held at United Nations Headquarters in New York from 4 to 6 August 2021, under silence procedure on 11 September 2020

Tenth session UN-GGIM

- Welcomed the report of the Expert Group on Land Administration and Management (E/C.20/2020/29), and noted its continued efforts to advocate and raise awareness of the merits and benefits of effective and efficient land administration and management through formulating and finalizing the Framework for Effective Land Administration as a reference for Member States when developing, reforming, strengthening and modernizing effective and efficient land administration processes and systems;
- b) Commended the broad global consultation and iterative review and editing process in preparing and finalizing the Framework for Effective Land Administration, taking into account the suggestions received in the written statements ahead of the tenth session of the Committee of Experts, and noted that the broad participation and responses from Member States and relevant stakeholders in the consultation ensured the global perspective of this Framework;
- Welcomed and adopted the Framework for Effective Land Administration, and requested that the Framework:

 i. Be a living document, periodically reviewed and updated, taking into consideration political, scoietal, economic, environmental, and technological circumstances;


 ii. Addresses the rights of indigenous peoples to lands, territories and resources, which they have traditionally owned, occupied or otherwise used or acquired; and

 iii. Encourages the use of internationally recognized standards, including ISO 19152 and IHO S-121;
- Appreciated that the Framework for Effective Land Administration is fully aligned with the Integrated Geospatial Information Framework as an overarching policy guide supporting the achievements of the Sustainable Development Goals for both developing and developed countries, noted that transparent and secure land and property rights for all is a crucial component for an economically, socially and environmentally sustainable society; and suggested the development of an assessment mechanism that account for all nine pathways to support its implementation;
- e) Encouraged the expert group to continue to: raise awareness and advocate for effective land administration in ensuring the Framework's usefulness within the context of antional circumstances; utilize the Implementation Guide of the Integrated Geospatial Information Formation Formatio
- Noted that the COVID-19 pandemic highlighted the critical need for reliable land information to support national responses in a timely manner, and encouraged volunt efforts from Member States to support the translation of the Framework into languages other than English.



Updates - Ninth plenary meeting of UN-GGIM-AP

Working Group 2: Cadastre and Land Management

Recommends that the Regional Committee of United Nations Global Geospatial Information Management for Asia and the Pacific:

- a) Continues to advocate and raise political awareness of the benefits of effective and efficient land administration and management as stipulated in UN-GGIM Decision 7/108;
- b) Supports the implementation of the Framework for Effective Land Administration, an overarching policy guidance for effective land administration and management, working with UN-GGIM Expert Group on Land Administration and Management;
- c) Participates in the country-level action plans of Integrated Geospatial Information Framework (IGIF) for better cadastre and land management;
- d) Addresses future challenges as well as the impacts of disruptive geospatial technologies in the context of cadastre and land management, working closely with the International Federation of Surveyors (FIG); and
- e) Encourages the Secretariat to explore possible options (in a cost neutral manner) for building a UN-GGIM-AP geospatial information service center with all interested Member States for practical provision of geospatial services and products to member countries of UN-GGIM-AP, considering cooperation with the United Nations Global Service Center of the United Nations Office on ICT (UN OICT) in Brindisi, Italy.


