The formal report of the Committee of Experts on its Eleventh session (see [E/2022/46-E/C.20/2021/16](#)) is available on the Committee's eleventh session web-site in all six official languages of the United Nations.

ECOSOC, at its 3rd plenary meeting of its 2022 Session on 1st November 2021, **adopted** the report of the Committee of Experts on its eleventh session with its recommendations and decisions, **decided** that its **twelfth session be held from 3 to 5 August 2022** and **approved** its provisional agenda as recommended.

Some major decisions to note –

- Supported the establishment of an ad-hoc task team comprising the Bureau and ‘friends of the co-Chairs’ of UN-GGIM, together with additional volunteered resources and expertise offered by Member States, to lead preparations and consult on the report on the implementation of Resolution 2016/27 ‘Strengthening Institutional Arrangements on Geospatial Information Management’ to be submitted to the 2022 ECOSOC Session.

Some major decisions to note –

- Endorsed the Strategic Plan of the High-Level Group on the Integrated Geospatial Information Framework (HLG-IGIF); recognized the urgency of adequately resourcing the refinement and finalization of the Implementation Guide, update of the Overarching Strategic Framework and completing related resource materials to assist Member States in the development of their respective country-level action plans; and noted the pressing need to obtain sustained funding for the implementation and iterative development of the IGIF.
- Welcomed the convening of the second United Nations World Geospatial Information Congress, with the theme 'Geo-Enabling the Global Village: No one should be left behind', planned for the week of 10–14 October 2022, at the Hyderabad International Convention Centre in Hyderabad, India, and hosted by the Government of India through its Ministry of Science and Technology.

The Committee of Experts on Global Geospatial Information Management:

(a) Welcomed the report of the expert group on land administration and management (see E/C.20/2021/10) and its focus on updating the expert group's workplan for the period 2020–2022, and expressed its appreciation for the efforts of the expert group in continuing to take practical outreach actions to advocate and raise awareness of the importance of timely and effective fit-for-purpose land administration that must be affordable and accessible by all;

(b) Expressed its appreciation for the expert group's utilization of the Implementation Guide of the Integrated Geospatial Information Framework as a reference resource when considering guidance to implement the Framework for Effective Land Administration at the country level and noted contributory efforts of the Expert Group to support the implementation of the Integrated Geospatial Information Framework;

- (c) Noted the initial consideration of the five key elements for implementing the Framework for Effective Land Administration at the country level, which translate concepts into practical guidance, and that the focus of those elements should include: modalities for sharing and exchanging knowledge, information and experiences, including relevant use cases, practices and examples; an assessment mechanism that considers the nine pathways of the Framework for Effective Land Administration and national circumstances of Member States; and appropriate collaborative efforts with regional committees, functional and thematic groups of the Committee and relevant international stakeholders;
- (d) Urged the Expert Group to further consider the increased and complex rights, restrictions and responsibilities associated with land; the increasingly digital and mobile access to land information; the integration of building information modelling and the cadastre; and the cybersecurity and data security mechanisms needed to protect vital land information assets;

- (e) Welcomed the volunteered efforts from Member States to translate the Framework for Effective Land Administration into languages other than English as an important step in continuing advocacy, raising awareness and promoting the merits and benefits of effective land administration and to improve access to and understanding of the Framework, and encouraged further volunteered efforts from other Member States to translate the Framework into additional languages, such as the proposal by Belgium to provide a translation into French;
- (f) Noted that the Expert Group planned to convene a formal meeting, together with an international seminar on effective land administration, when global conditions permit.

Written statements: Member states



- Australia - transactions processed e.g., via cell phones in future, where LA systems will become fully digital, security of data important (cybersecurity, risk), focus on security mechanisms needed to be put in place to protect valuable data assets. GIS is great and must make it easier for anyone to navigate in LA systems
- Belgium – supported the suggestion for EuroSDR European-level applied research project on the benefits of implementing FELA
- Chile – Stressed importance of translation
- Germany - concrete actions based on five key elements, requested membership in Expert Group
- India - launched countrywide scheme to integrate property validation for rural India.
- Ireland – Supported a formal meeting together with an international seminar on effective land administration
- Jamaica - wanted to implement FELA and identifies local Ministries, Departments, Agencies, Institutions and Organisations
- Mexico – an evaluation mechanism that considers nine pathways
- Netherlands – Important to enhance access via translated FELA
- Philippines – Welcomed initial consideration to operationalize FELA
- Singapore - integration of BIM and Cadastre from the technical and organisational aspects (e.g., facility management and dispute settlement within a building), currently developing a Whole-of-Government regulatory submission workflow
- Sweden – suggested development of evaluation tool or assessment mechanism to better understand which initiatives are more important

Work Plan for 2020/2022

During the 16th session the United Nations Committee of Experts on Global Geospatial Information Management (UN-GGIM) reviewed and adopted the Framework for Effective Land Administration (FLA) as a reference for Member States when developing, reforming, consolidating, strengthening and modernising land administration and management. The 16th session of UN-GGIM requested the Expert Group (continue to):

- i) take evidence and advocate for effective land administration;
- ii) ensuring the usefulness of the adopted Framework for Effective Land Administration (FLA) as a reference for national administrations;

Further the Expert Group is requested to:

- a) utilize the Implementation Guide of the Integrated Geospatial Information Framework as a reference resource when developing guidance to implement the FLA at the country level;
- b) share and exchange knowledge, information and experiences, including relevant case laws, practices and examples;
- c) address cultural, professional and technological barriers, particularly in Africa, and
- d) engage and collaborate with the United Nations Global Geospatial Information Management regional committees and thematic groups as appropriate.

UN-GGIM further noted that the coronavirus disease (COVID-19) pandemic had highlighted the critical need for reliable land information to support national responses.

The Expert Group also undertakes work that contributes to the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) and other areas as appropriate including, access to land, property rights, connectivity, land degradation, rapid urbanization, and climate change. And working in coordination with other expert and working groups noting that the overarching principle of the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development is to leave no one behind.

For the 2020 – 2022 period, the work plan of the Expert Group will thus focus on:

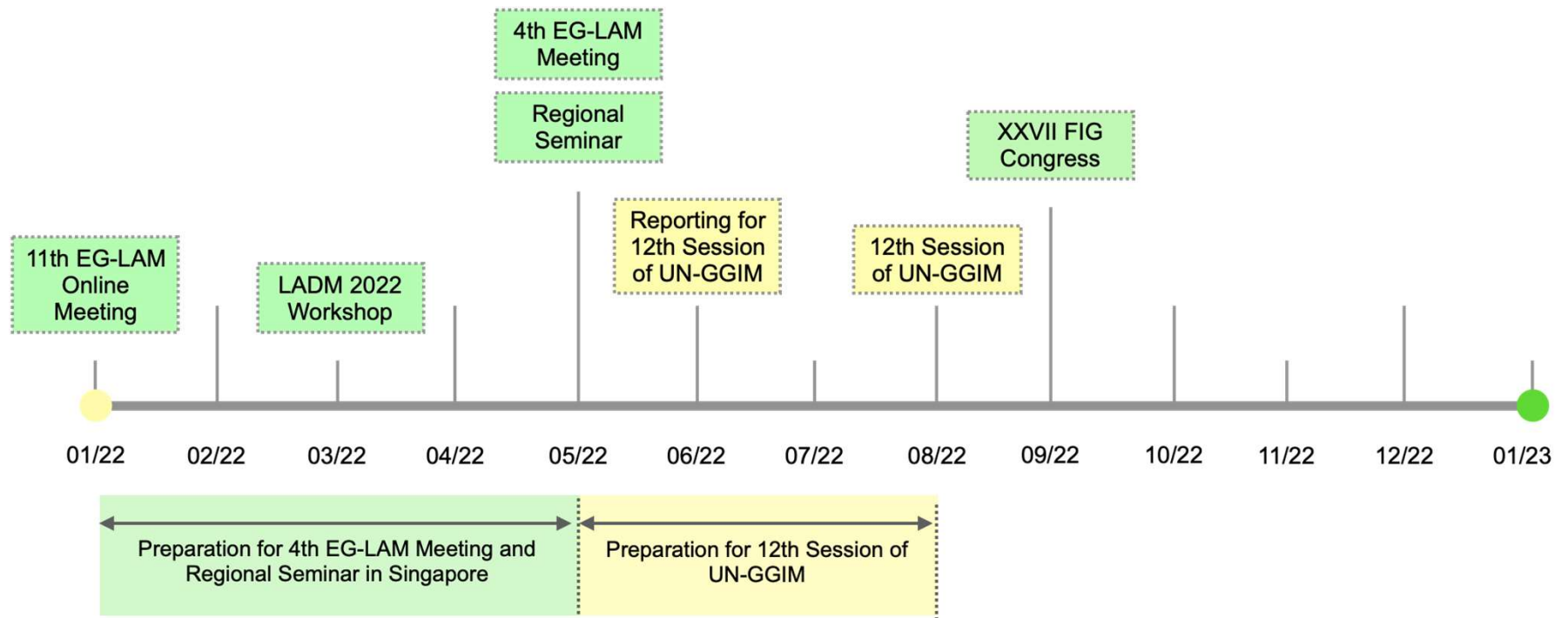
